## RECOGNITION AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

### **A. Board Service of Darrell Donelson**

Mr. Darrell Donelson served on the Board for four years, winning his seat in 2005, but his service to the community and dedication as an educator has been a lifelong commitment.

Darrell first worked for the district as a teacher and eventually moved to administration as an assistant principal and then principal. He led the opening of Becker School in 1992, where his warm and friendly demeanor instantly created a sense of family at the school.

During his thirty-nine and a half years with Dearborn Schools he spoke at six national conferences and mentored six present-day Dearborn administrators.

Mr. Donelson's years of experience and common sense approach have made him a well-liked and respected member of the Dearborn community. The Dearborn Public Schools thanks Mr. Donelson for his lifelong commitment to the children in the community. ## **SPECIAL REPORTS**

### **Elementary Interventionist: Ms. Norma Jean Sass, Associate Superintendent, Elementary Education**

The Reading Intervention Specialist position was created in 2009 to serve struggling readers in early elementary. The .5 position was added at each elementary school and is a member of the Response to Intervention Team (RTI). Reading Intervention Specialists provided service in addition to classroom instruction to students in first through third grade assessed below grade level in reading. They worked with the students in 35 minute sessions, 5 times a week. The goal is to have students reading books at grade level for lengthy periods of time. This was accomplished by building stamina through uninterrupted reading plus word work, vocabulary instruction and fluency practice. From September, 2009 to June 2010, 497 students were served by the program: 226 in first grade; 162 in second grade; and 109 in third grade. Average text level growth by grade for all schools and all students breaks down as follows: first grade: 9.18 levels; second grade: 15.5 levels; third grade: 14.5 levels. Second and third grade students had gains that surpassed the average text level gain for their grade level peers. Overall 58% of the lowest students made significant gains in the program.
