Bryant Middle School Morning Traffic Issues / Drop-Off Change

To All Morning Drop-Off Drivers:

To those who do not know me, I am Corporal Chad Hanson and I am a School Resource Officer with the Dearborn Police Department, assigned to Bryant Middle School. For the past three years, I have assisted with directing traffic at the intersection of Coburn and Vernon during the morning drop-off period. This year, after evaluating the first two weeks of drop-offs, I have come to the conclusion that traffic congestion has reached an all-time high, compromising student safety.

I truly believe, with the cooperation of everyone, this situation can be corrected. In order to create a safe and efficient drop-off environment for students, I would like to make the following suggestions:

- Remain off your cell phone while dropping off.
- Pay attention to my direction when you reach the intersection.
- Do not park in the vicinity of the intersection or in the bus drop-off area.
- Do not take more than 30 seconds to drop-off your student.
- Do not allow your students to exit your vehicle into oncoming traffic.

In addition, I am enforcing a new traffic flow pattern. Please take a moment to familiarize yourself with the attached traffic flow map and route changes. Changing traffic flow is never an easy thing to do; it requires the support and participation of all drivers in order to work. Hopefully, these changes will create a safer drop-off experience for you and your students.
