# Dearborn Schools Offering Free Lunch, Breakfast to All Students

Dearborn Public Schools is now expanding it's free lunch program to all students, regardless of family income. The District was recently informed by the Michigan Department of Education (MDE) that it was eligible to offer free meals across the district based on criteria in the Community Eligibility Program (CEP) under the U.S. Department of Agriculture's school meals program. Free meals went into effect as of September 10, 2018.

This is a very exciting time for our district to have the opportunity to serve all students free breakfast and lunch in our schools. Just a reminder that there are still guidelines we have to follow with this program. Please remember that that the first meal is free which at breakfast consists of milk, grain, fruit &/or vegetable. Lunch is milk, grain, protein, fruit, vegetable. If a student wants a second meal, it is not free. It would be charged as a breakfast or lunch. If a student only wants a milk, it is not free. It is part of a meal.

### At Lunch:

A student must take at least three components in the required serving sizes. One selection must be at least ½ cup from either the fruit or vegetable component.

### At Breakfast:

A student must select at least three food items, one of which must be 1/2 cup of fruit.

# **School Zone Safety**

The Dearborn Police Department takes your children's safety seriously and so must you. With the beginning of the new school year I would like to remind parents that we understand how congested and frustrating school zones can become in the morning and afternoon when dropping off or picking up children. However, poor driving habits, parking violations, and aggressive driving near schools, all create an unsafe environment for our children. We are asking all parents to do their part in promoting "safe and orderly- school zones" to ensure child safety.

To help reduce congestion and provide a safer environment keep these points in mind when dropping off or picking up your children:

- The bus stop is for buses only.
- Walk children to school when possible.
- Drop off/pick up children a short distance away from school, when/if possible. This
  alleviates traffic congestion around our schools.
- Once your child is out of the car and safely on the sidewalk vacate the area to make room for other parents to drop off their children. (Do Not - Double Park)
- Be mindful of school staff and crossing guards. They are there for your child's safety.
- Be a 'Good Neighbor', by being mindful of residents who live near school zones.

As part of our commitment to ensuring our children's safety, The Dearborn Police Department will be actively enforcing traffic laws around all school zones:

- Blocking driveways: \$80 fine
- Double parking: \$80 fine
- Stop sign violation: 3 points \$150 fine
- Fail to yield to pedestrian: 2 points \$150 fine
- Fail to yield to School Bus: 3 points \$240 fine
- Disobey a school crossing guard: Misdemeanor

Chickenpox	Keep child home until they have no new sores for 24 hours AND all

	sick with the infection will not be allowed at school for 21 days after they	
	were last exposed to chickenpox, even if they are not sick.

Fever with temperature 100°	Keep child home until fever-free for 24 hours without using fever-

Ringworm	If ringworm is first found at school, child may stay until end of the day if	
	it can be covered. Child may not return until treatment has been started.

Scabies	Child must stay home until after treatment is started.
