Your child has expressed interest in running the 8th Annual Robert Cipriano Memorial Cross Country Run on Friday, October 11th at Ford Field Park in Dearborn. All students in grades 4th-8th may participate in this race. The cost of participation is \$3 per student.

Middle school students:

This year our run will take place during the afternoon, as DPS students have a ½ day in the morning. Middle school students will compete in a two-mile race. Our first race will start at 1:20 pm with each subsequent race starting approximately 20 minutes after the previous race. Please note your child's race time below.

New this year, we will provide transportation to and from school for any middle school student that wants to participate. Students choosing to be bussed to the race must make arrangements with their physical education teacher, before race day. Students that ride the bus to the race are expected to ride back to school on the bus unless communicated beforehand with their PE teacher.

With existing bonds expiring, the District can generate approximately \$240 million from the sale of new bonds without increasing the current millage rate. This bond would not increase tax rates for residents.

The District is calling the proposal BRICS because the funded projects focus on Buildings, Renovations, Infrastructure, Capacity and Safety.

Dearborn Public Schools is asking voter approval on a bond in November 2019.

A bond committee has been working to winnow a list of \$500 million in needed capital improvements, plus additional possible expenses for items like security, capacity, technology and educational upgrades.

It will be necessary for the Dearborn Public Schools Board of Education to seek voter approval for a bond in order to finance necessary capital outlay projects.

- Citizen Infrastructure Task Force Recommendation (as presented December 12, 2018)

How much wear and tear each year?

- Dearborn Public Schools- 3.7 million students attend school (20,700 students x 180 school days = 3.7 million)
- The Henry Ford- Nearly 1.8 million visitors
- C Comerica Park 1.8 million (2018 Tigers season only)
- Ford Field 1.5 million (expected annual attendance all events)

Why Now?

There are several factors driving the decision to ask for a bond vote in November 2019.

- New bonds could be issued without raising millage rates for residents.
- A November election would allow work to begin as early as Spring 2020.
- Interest rates are still low, but expected to climb. Waiting could mean less money for construction and more spent paying interest costs.
- This type of major construction cannot be paid from the general fund without drastic cuts to programs. State per pupil funding to the district is still less than in 2008.

We have been working hard over the summer to add some new items to each campus and wanted to share some of the changes with everyone. We are pleased to announce that SFE (Southwest Foodservice Excellence) became the new food service management partner at Dearborn Schools on July 1, 2019. As a result of this partnership, we are pleased to announce the following changes:

- **All meat served district-wide will be certified halal. More information is available on the foodservice website.**
- All meals district-wide will continue to be free.
- We pledge a focus on fresh-from-scratch cooking and menu variety.
- Fresh fruit and vegetable salad bars will be available daily at lunch. While this will be free for students who purchase a meal, salad bar access also will be available as an a la carte option.
- Full nutritional information is posted for all menu items on the Dearborn Schools website .
- The Roving Chef program is available. This fun and interactive culinary program will provide principal-selected students with special instruction in nutrition, proper food safety/cooking techniques and healthy meal preparation—all while working alongside a real chef.
- A variety of entrées will be offered daily to appeal to student tastes and preferences, with on-trend culinary concepts that including recipes from a variety of cuisines.
- A selection of 3 entrée choices will be offered daily for Elementary students, consisting of the menu items listed above. Middle Schools will have 4-6 options and High School students will be offered 6-8 options daily.
- A dedicated team of professionals including chefs and nutrition coordinators will be in Dearborn daily working with staff and students.

Along the way, we plan to request frequent feedback from our students through regular taste tests and panels. That's because we are dedicated to creating custom menus and programs that get every student excited to eat at school, knowing they will find nutritious foods that they love. - نعتهد بالتركيز على الطهي الطازج من الصفر وننوّع قائمة الوجبات المتوفرة.
- ستوفر خيارات مفتوحة من أنواع سلطة الخضار والفواكه الطازجة يوميًا على الغداء. ستكون هذه الخيارات مجانية للطلاب الذين يتسرون وجبة وستكون متاحة أيضاً كخيار انتقالي.
- سننشر المعلومات الغذائية الكاملة لكافة عناصر القائمة على موقع مدارس ديربورن.
- يتوفر برنامج Roving Chef، وهو برنامج طهي مرح وتفاعلي يوفر للطلاب الذين يختار هم المدرء تعليمات خاصة في مجال التغذية والتعبئة المناسية الخاصة بالطهي وسلامة الغذاء وإعداد الوجبات الصحية - وكل ذلك في أثناء العمل جنباً إلى جنب مع طاهٍ حقيقي.
- ستوفر مجموعة متنوعة من المقبلات يوميًا لتلبية أذواق الطلاب وتفضيلاتهم، وذلك إلى جانب أفكار عصرية في الطهي تستعمل على وصفات من مطابخ متنوعة.
- ستوفر مجموعة من ثلاث مقبلات يوميًا ليختار منها الطلاب في المدرسة الابتدائية، على أن تتكوّن من عناصر من القائمة المذكورة. وستوفر من 4 إلى 6 خيارات يوميًا في المدارس المتوسطة و6 إلى 8 خيارات في المدارس الثانوية.
- سيتواجد فريق متخصص من المهنيين، بمن فيهم طهاة ومنسقين غذائيين، يوميًا في ديربورن للعمل مع الموظفين والطلاب.

نسعى دائماً إلى طلب آراء طلابنا من خلال تجارب التذوّق المنتظمة ولجان التذوّق، ومرّد ذلك إلى التزامنا بوضع قوائم وبرامج طعام خاصة تجعل كل طالب يشعر بالحماس لتناول الطعام في المدرسة، إذ أنه سيعرف أنه سيجد مأكولات مغذية بحبها. وأكثر من ذلك، نريد أن نتأكّد -مثلكم تماماً - من أن الطلاب سعداء ويتمتعون بصحة جيدة ويحصلون على تغذية جيدة ليتعلّموا.

Bryant Middle School Traffic Issues

To those who do not know me, I am Corporal Chad Hanson and I am a School Resource Officer with the Dearborn Police Department, assigned to Bryant Middle School. I receive many complaints each year about the traffic congestion during the morning arrival and afternoon dismissal periods. I would like to make the following suggestions that I believe will help alleviate many of the reported issues:

- Remain off your cell phone while dropping off/pick-up your child
- Do not text and drive
- Do not park in the vicinity of the Coburn & Vernon intersection or in the bus drop off area
- Do not block any crosswalks/driveways
- Do not park in any private, residential driveway
- Do not park more than 12" from the curb
- Do not park within 15' of an intersection/fire hydrant
- Do not park within 30' of a stop sign
- Do not take more than 30 seconds to drop-off your child
- Do not stop in the roadway and your child to exit your vehicle into oncoming traffic
- Be courteous to all drivers
- Do not drop off your student, facing oncoming traffic (driver side wheels to curb).
- Do not do U-Turns (including pulling into residential driveways) during peak drop-off/pick-up times

If everyone does these things, I believe we will be on our way to creating a safe and efficient pick-up and drop-off environment, free of complaints. It will take the participation and effort of everyone to accomplish this goal.

I have attached a traffic flow pattern that will also assist in increasing safety, reduce congestion and allow for better traffic flow during drop-off and pick-up times. Please take a moment and review the attached traffic flow map and notice the preferred route, which is highlighted in yellow.

I appreciate your continued support and cooperation in this matter and hope we can work together to continually improve the safety of everyone in the Bryant School Community.

The bus lane on Rex Street is dedicated for busses ONLY during the morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up times to allow busses to safely load and unload students. Please do not enter the bus lane between 7:30am-8:15am or 2:30pm-3:30pm. Thank you in advance for your support!



When to Keep Your Child Home from School

Illness	What to do?
Chickenpox	Keep child home until they have no new sores for 24 hours AND all sores are dried and crusted. **During an outbreak of chickenpox, children who are <u>NOT</u> vaccinated for chickenpox (Varicella) and have been in close contact with someone sick with the infection will not be allowed at school for 21 days after they were last exposed to chickenpox, even if they are not sick.
Diarrhea that cannot be controlled and/or with a fever.	Keep child at home.
Fever with temperature 100° or higher and not feeling well enough to participate in class.	Keep child home until fever-free for 24 hours <u>without</u> using fever-reducing medicine such as Motrin or Tylenol.
Flu-like symptoms with fever, chills, sore throat, runny nose, muscle aches, tiredness; may also have vomiting and diarrhea.	Keep child home until symptoms are gone.
Head lice	If lice are first found at school, child may stay until end of the day but may not return until treated and all live lice are gone.
Impetigo	Keep child home until 24 hours after antibiotics have been started.
MRSA	Keep child home if sore is draining and cannot be covered with a clean, dry bandage. Keep child home if they cannot keep from picking at sore.
Rash	Keep child home until seen by a doctor and treated if needed. The school may request a doctor's note to return to school.
Strep throat	Keep child home until 24 hours after antibiotics have been started.
Pink eye with discharge	Keep child home until seen by a doctor and 24 hours after first dose of medicine, if prescribed.
Ringworm	If ringworm is first found at school, child may stay until end of the day if it can be covered. Child may not return until treatment has been started. Area must remain covered until completely healed.
Scabies	Child must stay home until after treatment is started.
Vomiting 2 or more times within 24 hours	Keep child home until able to tolerate regular diet.

الجدري	بقاء الطالب في المنزل لغاية عدم وجود تقرحات جديدة لمدة 24 ساعة وحتى تجف جميع القروح وتقرش. ** لن يسمح للأطفال الذين لم يتم تلقيحهم بجدري الماء والذين على اتصال وثيق مع شخص مصاب بالجدري الحضور إلى المدرسة لمدة 21 يوماً، حتى لو لم يكتوا مصابين .
الإسهال الذي لا يمكن السيطرة عليه و / أو مع الحمى.	يجب على الطالب البقاء في المنزل
حمى مع درجة حرارة 100 درجة أو أعلى وعدم شعور الطالب القدرة على المشاركة في الصف.	بقاء الطالب في المنزل لمدة 24 ساعة بدون حمى وبتون استخدام الأنوية التي تحد من الحمى مثل موترين أو تايلينول.
أعراض تشبه الإنفلونزا مع حمى، فشريرة، التهاب الحلق وسيلان الأنف، وآلام في العضلات، والتعب، أو القيء والإسهال.	بقاء الطالب في المنزل حتى تزول العوارض.
قمل الرأس	إذا تم العثور على القمل في المدرسة، قد يبقى الطالب في المدرسة حتى نهاية النوم ولكن لن يسمح له بالعودة حتى يعالج القمل بالكامل.
الحصص الجلدي	بقاء الطالب في المنزل لغاية 24 ساعة بعد أخذ المضادات الحيوية.
MRSA العنقودية الذهبية المقاومة للمثيبين	بقاء الطالب في المنزل إذا كانت القرحة تنزف وإذا لن يتمكنوا من عدم لمس القرحة.
طفح جلدي	بقاء الطالب في المنزل حتى يقوم بزيارة الطبيب. قد تطلب المدرسة رسالة من الطبيب تؤكد سماح الطالب العودة إلى المدرسة.
البيكتيريا العقدية (الحلق)	البقاء في المنزل لمدة 24 ساعة بعد العلاج بالمضاد الحيوي.
التهاب ملتحمه (العين الوردية)	البقاء في المنزل حتى زيارة الطبيب وبعد 24 ساعة من أول جرعة نواء.
القوباء الحلقية (الثعلبة)	البقاء في المنزل لمدة 24 ساعة بعد العلاج بالمضاد الحيوي.
الجرب	بقاء في المنزل حتى يتم العلاج نهائياً.
القيء مرتان أو أكثر لمدة 24 ساعة	بقاء في المنزل لغاية زوال الحالة.
