I hope everyone had a relaxing summer vacation and is excited to return to school. We have been working hard over the summer to add some new items to each campus and wanted to share some of the changes with everyone. We are pleased to announce that SFE (Southwest Foodservice Excellence) became the new food service management partner at Dearborn Schools on July 1, 2019. As a result of this partnership, we are pleased to announce the following changes:

- **All meat served district-wide will be certified halal. More information is available on the foodservice website.**
- All meals district-wide will continue to be free.
- We pledge a focus on fresh-from-scratch cooking and menu variety.
- Fresh fruit and vegetable salad bars will be available daily at lunch. While this will be free for students who purchase a meal, salad bar access also will be available as an a la carte option.
- Full nutritional information is posted for all menu items on the Dearborn Schools website.
- The Roving Chef program is available. This fun and interactive culinary program will provide principal-selected students with special instruction in nutrition, proper food safety/cooking techniques and healthy meal preparation—all while working alongside a real chef.
- A variety of entrées will be offered daily to appeal to student tastes and preferences, with on-trend culinary concepts that including recipes from a variety of cuisines.

- يتوفر برنامج Roving Chef، وهو برنامج طهي مرح وتفاعلي يوفر للطلاب الذين يختار هم المدراء تعليمات خاصة في مجال التغذية والتغذية المناسبة الخاصة بالطهي وسلامة الغذاء وإعداد الوجبات الصحية - وكل ذلك في أثناء العمل جنباً إلى جنب مع طاهٍ حقيقي.

Bryant Middle School Traffic Issues

To those who do not know me, I am Corporal Chad Hanson and I am a School Resource Officer with the Dearborn Police Department, assigned to Bryant Middle School. I receive many complaints each year about the traffic congestion during the morning arrival and afternoon dismissal periods. I would like to make the following suggestions that I believe will help alleviate many of the reported issues:

- Remain off your cell phone while dropping off/pick-up your child
- Do not text and drive
- Do not park in the vicinity of the Coburn & Vernon intersection or in the bus drop off area
- Do not block any crosswalks/driveways
- Do not park in any private, residential driveway
- Do not park more than 12" from the curb
- Do not park within 15' of an intersection/fire hydrant
- Do not park within 30' of a stop sign
- Do not take more than 30 seconds to drop-off your child
- Do not stop in the roadway and your child to exit your vehicle into oncoming traffic
- Be courteous to all drivers
- Do not drop off your student, facing oncoming traffic (driver side wheels to curb).
- Do not do U-Turns (including pulling into residential driveways) during peak drop-off/pick-up times

If everyone does these things, I believe we will be on our way to creating a safe and efficient pick-up and drop-off environment, free of complaints. It will take the participation and effort of everyone to accomplish this goal.

I have attached a traffic flow pattern that will also assist in increasing safety, reduce congestion and allow for better traffic flow during drop-off and pick-up times. Please take a moment and review the attached traffic flow map and notice the preferred route, which is highlighted in yellow.

I appreciate your continued support and cooperation in this matter and hope we can work together to continually improve the safety of everyone in the Bryant School Community.

The bus lane on Rex Street is dedicated for busses ONLY during the morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up times to allow busses to safely load and unload students. Please do not enter the bus lane between 7:30am-8:15am or 2:30pm-3:30pm. Thank you in advance for your support!



When to Keep Your Child Home from School

Illness	What to do?
Chickenpox	Keep child home until they have no new sores for 24 hours AND all sores are dried and crusted. **During an outbreak of chickenpox, children who are <u>NOT</u> vaccinated for chickenpox (Varicella) and have been in close contact with someone sick with the infection will not be allowed at school for 21 days after they were last exposed to chickenpox, even if they are not sick.
Diarrhea that cannot be controlled and/or with a fever.	Keep child at home.
Fever with temperature 100° or higher and not feeling well enough to participate in class.	Keep child home until fever-free for 24 hours <u>without</u> using fever-reducing medicine such as Motrin or Tylenol.
Flu-like symptoms with fever, chills, sore throat, runny nose, muscle aches, tiredness; may also have vomiting and diarrhea.	Keep child home until symptoms are gone.
Head lice	If lice are first found at school, child may stay until end of the day but may not return until treated and all live lice are gone.
Impetigo	Keep child home until 24 hours after antibiotics have been started.
MRSA	Keep child home if sore is draining and cannot be covered with a clean, dry bandage. Keep child home if they cannot keep from picking at sore.
Rash	Keep child home until seen by a doctor and treated if needed. The school may request a doctor's note to return to school.
Strep throat	Keep child home until 24 hours after antibiotics have been started.
Pink eye with discharge	Keep child home until seen by a doctor and 24 hours after first dose of medicine, if prescribed.
Ringworm	If ringworm is first found at school, child may stay until end of the day if it can be covered. Child may not return until treatment has been started. Area must remain covered until completely healed.
Scabies	Child must stay home until after treatment is started.
Vomiting 2 or more times within 24 hours	Keep child home until able to tolerate regular diet.

الإسهال الذي لا يمكن السيطرة عليه و / أو مع الحمى.	يجب على الطالب البقاء في المنزل
حمى مع درجة حرارة 100 درجة أو أعلى وعدم شعور الطالب القدرة على المشاركة في الصف.	بقاء الطالب في المنزل لمدة 24 ساعة بدون حمى وبتون استخدام الأنوية التي تحد من الحمى مثل موترين أو تايلينول.
أعراض تشبه الإنفلونزا مع حمى، فشريرة، التهاب الحلق وسيلان الأنف، وآلام في العضلات، والتعب، أو القيء والإسهال.	بقاء الطالب في المنزل حتى تزول العوارض.
قمل الرأس	إذا تم العثور على القمل في المدرسة، قد يبقى الطالب في المدرسة حتى نهاية النوم ولكن لن يسمح له بالعودة حتى يعالج القمل بالكامل.
الحصص الجلدي	بقاء الطالب في المنزل لغاية 24 ساعة بعد أخذ المضادات الحيوية.
MRSA العنقودية الذهبية المقاومة للمثيلين	بقاء الطالب في المنزل إذا كانت القرحة تنزف وإذا لن يتمكنوا من عدم لمس القرحة.
طفح جلدي	بقاء الطالب في المنزل حتى يقوم بزيارة الطبيب. قد تطلب المدرسة رسالة من الطبيب تؤكد سماح الطالب العودة إلى المدرسة.
البيكتيريا العقدية (الحلق)	البقاء في المنزل لمدة 24 ساعة بعد العلاج بالمضاد الحيوي.
التهاب ملتحمه (العين الوردية)	البقاء في المنزل حتى زيارة الطبيب وبعد 24 ساعة من أول جرعة نواء.
القوباء الحلقية (الثعلبة)	البقاء في المنزل لمدة 24 ساعة بعد العلاج بالمضاد الحيوي.
الجرب	بقاء في المنزل حتى يتم العلاج نهائياً.
القيء مرتان أو أكثر لمدة 24 ساعة	بقاء في المنزل لغاية زوال الحالة.
