**IN ORDER TO RECEIVE YOUR SCHEDULE, YOU MUST TURN IN A CURRENT EMERGENCY FORM SIGNED BY A PARENT/GUARDIAN.**

All students will enter at the GYM doors to the west of the cafeteria from the student parking lot.  
School Pictures - All students will be photographed by a professional photographer at the time of registration for the year-book and for student ID's. This service is free. Students will have the option of buying a variety of packets.

Outstanding Fines and Delinquencies - All fines and other delinquencies must be cleared before the student schedule will be issued. **Parents may arrange a payment plan with permission of an administrator.**

Physicals - (9th Grade Students) - Ninth graders new to Edsel Ford High School must present their physical form at the time of registration. Those 9th graders who will be going out for a sport must submit their white sports physicals before beginning practice. The student will still need to submit the green physical form at schedule pick-up. Written confirmation (bearing a parent signature) of doctor appointments scheduled after your assigned scheduled pick-up date will be temporarily accepted in place of the green physical form at schedule pick-up. Students will not be allowed to participate in Physical Education without a physical and their lack of participation will affect their grade.

Parent Connect – Parent Connect is an online program designed to keep you updated on your student’s grades and attendance. Sign up and you will be able to access your student’s progress online at your convenience. **IF YOU ARE ALREADY REGISTERED YOU DO NOT NEED TO RE-REGISTER.** Parent Connect is dormant during the summer and will be up and running after the school year has started. Applications are available in any of the offices at the school.

Parking Stickers - Student drivers must have a parking sticker on the lower left front window of their car. Cars will be routinely checked in the parking lot and parking tickets will be issued. Cost is \$20.00 for the year.

Athletic Passes – Athletic passes for students will be on sale for \$25 for the first two weeks of school. For more information go to [www.efhs.dearbornschools.org/sports](http://www.efhs.dearbornschools.org/sports) Passes allow students free entry to all home athletic events. Entry fees for athletic events are: \$3 – Freshmen contests, \$5 – JV & Varsity contests. Adult athletic passes requires Booster Club membership. Please see enclosed form. Dear Student,

Historically, school districts have allowed their students to also attend classes at local colleges or universities in an effort to meet students' needs and interests. This is called Postsecondary Enrollment Option (PSEO) (a.k.a. - **dual enrollment**).

Our legislators have refined legislation which directs school districts to pay all (or a portion of) the tuition and fees of a high school 11th or 12th grade student who has elected to take classes at a public or private degree-granting postsecondary institution, **if the following conditions are met:**

- The pupil is enrolled and attending at least one high school course at a Dearborn Public School.
- A student is in grades 11 or 12 and has met the requirements for an endorsement in all subject areas of the Michigan Educational Assessment Program (MEAP) and or MME. Such student would be eligible for courses in the subject area(s) in which the student has completed the requirements for an endorsement, or computer science and foreign language courses not offered by the district, or fine arts programs as permitted by the district.

**NOTE:** To meet this criteria, an eleventh grade student must have taken and achieved a qualifying score in all subject areas on the ACT, PLAN or the college PSAT readiness assessment. There are exceptions if the student did not achieve a qualifying score in all subject areas and would like to dual enroll. The student needs to contact their counselor or scheduling principal to inquire about his/her options.

Payments made to the postsecondary institution by the local school district will be determined through a formula that involves the districts' foundation allowance from the state. Any remaining tuition or fees are the responsibility of the student.

Pursuant to Section 1150 of Public Act 335, college level courses will appear on high school transcripts. Upon successful completion of the course, appropriate credit earned will be applied toward graduation. The current district-wide weighted grading system will be applied. It is the responsibility of the student to have official transcripts sent from the postsecondary institution to their high school.

If you are considering attending a local postsecondary institution during the year, you may qualify under the above listed criteria. Please share this information with your parents and **contact your counselor** for further assistance.

SUBJECT: **PROPER ATTIRE – ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE**

In the educational arena, we as administrators annually assess if revisions are needed to current language for issues such as proper attire. At the close of last school year it became quite evident that current fashion trends (i.e. spaghetti string tops, tank tops, short shorts and mini-skirts) were not appropriate for a school setting or conducive to our existing proper attire language. Therefore, we have adjusted our language to meet these current fashion trends.

As with many issues of this nature, we always struggle with language that will be clear and fair. Our main goal is always to provide an educational environment that is conducive to learning. We believe it is obligatory that we do everything possible to prevent students from being distracted.

When school opens we will immediately begin the educational process of making our students aware of our position on this matter. We will not allow students to attend classes who have violated these guidelines. If, in an administrator's opinion, violations of these guidelines become habitual, that student will be charged with insubordination and disciplined according to the Student Code of Conduct.

In closing, it is our hope that the parent, the student and school officials will work together to make Edsel Ford High School the best place possible for students to learn. We hope this letter has made it to your mailbox prior to the traditional school shopping trip. The following excerpt taken from the District-wide Code of Conduct is intended as a reminder to staff and students regarding proper attire for a school setting:

The Dearborn Board of Education and the administration are responsible for providing facilities and conditions that allow and encourage the educational program to be conducted in an atmosphere of dignity, respect, and good taste, as well as safety and cleanliness. Within broad limits, a student's dress and grooming may be considered a matter of his/her parent's choice. Any restrictions on dress and grooming are designed to assure students a wide range of dress without permitting apparel which is distracting to the learning process.

The following factors are to be considered in determining student dress and grooming regulations:

1. Cleanliness and other aspects of personal hygiene
2. Decency
3. Maintenance of an atmosphere conducive to learning
4. Safety in terms of hazards that inappropriate dress and grooming present to the student group in a school setting
5. Compliance with standards of dress and grooming that are generally considered acceptable in our community and in contemporary society

In judging the appropriateness of student dress, the following regulations apply:

1. Clothing should be modest and avoid distracting influences.
  - a. **No tops, blouses, or dresses which reveal a bare shoulder will be allowed.**  
(Sleeveless dresses must have at least 3 inches of material from neckline to shoulder)
  - b. **Shorts, skirts, and dresses shall not be higher than the first knuckle (next to the fingernail) of the second index finger when the student's arms are held straight down next to their sides.**
2. Footwear must be worn.
3. Sunglasses may be worn only with the permission of a principal upon the recommendation of a doctor or health official.
4. Clothing or shoes which damage school property are not permitted.
5. Clothing displaying offensive or inappropriate pictures or writing which includes but is not limited to topics of sex, tobacco, alcohol and other drugs is not permitted.
6. Outerwear, including hats, hoodies and jackets, are not to be worn in school.
7. Clothing, jewelry, symbols, or other things that may be perceived as denoting membership in a gang are not permitted.
8. Clothing which displays a bare midriff or is mutilated and reveals undergarments is not permitted.
9. Clothing accessories such as chains attached to clothing or wallet, studded jewelry or other accessories that could be used as a weapon are not permitted.

Your cooperation in abiding by the district Code of Conduct is appreciated. Teachers who discover students that have violated this section of the Code of Conduct are asked to reteach and follow the School Wide PBIS expectations and process.

NOTE: Final determination of appropriateness will be made by the administration. If the determination is the student's clothing is in violation of the Student code of Conduct, the student will be asked to change clothes or go home to get appropriate clothing.
