# 9th Grade: Career Exploration in the Freshman Academy

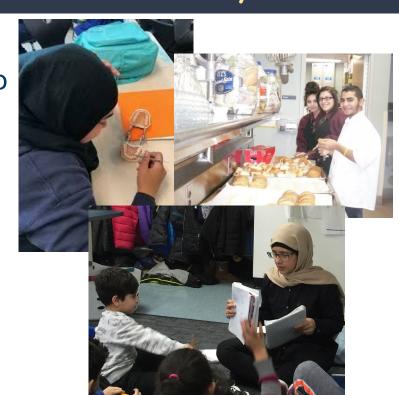
- YouScience: Career Exploration and Aptitude Program

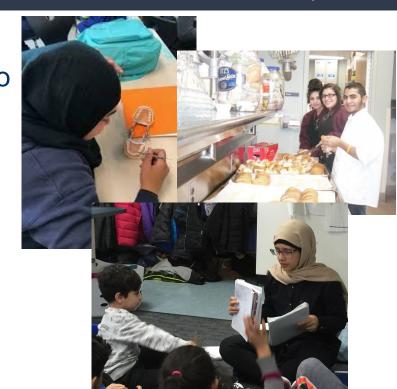






## 11th Grade: Continue Career Academy
