Morning Supervision:

As a reminder, Lowrey students are not to arrive to school until 7:45 a.m. They will be required to stand outside unless it is raining. Students should not arrive early, unless they are going to the cafeteria for breakfast. Parents are not permitted to walk down to the cafeteria with their children to breakfast. We want to help our students build independence.

Reading

Research has shown that reading is vital to the success of students in all subject areas; if students can't read, they can't begin to understand what they're reading in any subject. Not being able to read will inevitably hinder the student's performance at school. So how do we help our students with their literacy? One of the most effective and easy ways to ensure students are improving their reading is by exposing them to print constantly. This means that children need access to a variety of books that they can read whenever they want. Also, making sure that the books are interesting and at the student's reading level, will increase interest for reading. Increased reading will lead to improvement in skills over time. Let your children read to each other or their friends. Give them a library in their rooms or somewhere in the house where they have some books that they own and cherish. Involve your children with anything that gets them involved in reading for information that produces a result they're interested in (like buying a certain snack, or convincing you of getting them a certain game, etc...) These things I've mentioned, coupled with the Daily 5 and Café program we use with the students, will ensure that students are provided with what they need. We encourage you to have conversations with your children's teachers to make sure you have all your questions answered regarding what you can do to choose appropriate books for your children. Dearborn residents also have the benefit of free access to the Dearborn Public Libraries. This is a priceless resource that you can use with your children to spend quality time while addressing their school needs. The Henry Ford Centennial Library has many resources with a wonderful children's section designed for supporting students at home or at the library if they stay and read. From the Classrooms of:

Kindergarten Teachers:

Giving our Lowrey Polar Bears the opportunity to set growth-oriented goals, and reflect upon their progress in meeting those goals, is fundamental to building a community of growth mindset learners. We set class goals, partnership goals, and individual goals. There is a sense of pride in our student's voice as they share meeting their NWEA or Reading goals. It is important for our students that once struggled to write more than a sentence on each page or read at grade level to achieve success through goal setting.

Becoming aware of their mindset by setting and tracking goals, helps our children build awareness of their growth and celebrate new learning. It can also help our children normalize mistakes as a part of the learning process, reflect upon the challenges in meeting a goal, and learn about ways to be flexible or ask for help.

The kindergarten teachers want to reiterate that it is helpful to give our students a clear way to track their progress in meeting a goal. For example, they might share their plan for meeting their goal with a partner, jot a visual reminder of the goal on a sticky note, tally the number of times they tried this goal, or place a sticker in their writing at each place they met the goal. In our classrooms, we display our goals to remind ourselves that we are a community of brain growers who celebrate one another's growth. We hope that talking to our Polar Bears about mindsets and creating growth goals are helpful in building Lowrey's community of mindset learners.

First Grade:

Hello Friends and Family,

April showers bring May flowers... The month of May is full of excitement for our first graders. We have our field trip to Greenfield Village on Monday, May 9th! Also, some of us have been or will be testing NWEA this upcoming week. Be sure to have your child get good rest and nutritious meals to insure that they will be able to do the be**st they can. Second Grade:

Third Grade

Spring time has arrived! Parents it is important to keep your kids' **<u>reading</u>** during this warm and exciting season! The key is to encourage your child to keep reading even when the sun peeks out! There are many ways to motivate kids to read. For example:

• Make reading time fun and a family event by creating a schedule, and reading along with your children. When your child takes notice of how much you enjoy reading, they will want to participate and join in all the fun. In addition, when you set a schedule time for reading, your child will know that he/she is expected to read daily during "schedule time" that they are accustomed to. It's never too late to start scheduling reading time at home!

• Make reading exciting by setting goals and rewards! By setting goals, you are holding your child accountable for their learning. Remember, when setting goals; make sure that the goals are realistic. Additionally, encourage the young learners by setting a reward for each achieved goal. The reward will keep the readers focused and inspired to continue reading.

Setting goals for your child is a great way to help encourage your child to accomplish their success. It is also a positive way to inspire kids to aim high and succeed in encouraging possibility.

Sixth Grade:

The 6^{th} grade has been bustling and busy working on curriculum and preparing for the two standardized tests this spring. The M-Step and the NWEA. As we wrap up the 5^{th} marking period of the school year, we are working hard to cover the last of our curriculum.

The M-Step will take place during the two week block of 4/25-5/6/16. Students will be testing in the Language Arts, and Math areas for the M-Step. Most students are testing on computers this year, which is the new state-wide initiative. We have practiced using sample tests and gave students the opportunity to explore the new format. We feel students will be prepared and confident to take this new version of the test.

The NWEA for 6th grade will take place in sections throughout the month of May. Science will be testing first, the following week will be Math NWEA, and the last subject for NWEA will be Language Arts.

We ask our 6^{th} grade families to encourage their children to take these tests seriously. This is a chance to show what has been learned, and display their academic talents. Getting enough sleep each night is key for students to be prepared and focused for the test. It is also extremely important for students to eat a healthy breakfast in the morning. Please help your 6^{th} grader be at their very best for these important assessments.

We look forward to our end of the year activities and field trips for 6^{th} graders. At the end of May (5/25/16) our 6^{th} graders will be visiting Hemlock Park (a Lowrey tradition). And early in June (6/1/16) we will be taking a fun field trip to celebrate the end of the school year. Watch for permission slips and information coming home soon.

Although the weather is becoming nicer, we would like to stress the importance of focus and good behavior at school. We know what wonderful young people we have in 6th grade, and would like to end the year with excellent and mature behavior.

Eighth Grade

The eighth-graders are relieved to have completed the Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress, the M-step, a two-week examination of student skills and knowledge in Language Arts, Mathematics, and Social Studies. In parts of the test, students were required to analyze sources and compose a written response to a prompt. Another section of the test was in the form of a Computer Adaptive Test, a test that selected test questions based on student responses. After a respite of a week, the eighth-graders will be taking the Northwest Educational Association test, (NWEA), to measure student progress in reading and language. This will be the third such test the students have taken this academic year. The tests are important indicators of student ability, and will be used in part to determine course placement in high school.

At the beginning of May, Mrs Makled will be taking a group of students to Washington, D. C. Additionally; Mrs. Makled is retiring at the end of this year. She has been a Social Studies teacher at Lowrey for over twenty years. The students and teachers will dearly miss her enthusiasm for teaching.

Students in Language Arts will be reading a very popular novel, <u>The Outsiders</u>. Students from past years on return visits have often fondly remembered this reading.
