write and the stamina for independent acts of literacy. These are the children who meet high Common Core Standards in literacy and beyond.

From the desk of the Kindergarten Teachers:

Excellence in kindergarten literacy is the vital foundation for bridging the achievement gap and building schools of ambitious, self-regulated readers and writers. Experiences in the educational arts engage children's multiple ways of learning while promoting creative and higher-order thinking; they take advantage of how the young child's brain learns best. Developing social-emotional intelligence supports children in being successful in school . . . and in life. Yes, we are preparing our children for the 21st century!!!

Writing is the key that unlocks the alphabetic code. So, collaboratively the Kindergarten teachers' definition of excellence includes cooperative learning, rich experiences in the arts, science exploration, respectful and supportive parent connections, a language-intensive "writing-to-read" environment, systematic phonemic awareness through songs, and an explicit multisensory ABC and phonics immersion program within a comprehensive literacy framework. So please continue to work with your child on their new literacy work at home through reading their mini-books and reading to them each and every day!!!

Hello First Grade Families,



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We have had a great start to the new school year! Your child should be bringing home a reading bag daily. Please have your child read the books for at least 20 minutes each night. A parent should sign the reading log after your child reads. Please ask your child questions after reading. What did the story make you think about? What part of the book did you like the best? Why? Who are the

characters? What is the setting? Your child is also bringing home written homework. Remember to provide a guiet place for your child to work. White boards, chalk or games help with spelling and writing practice. Making learning fun goes a long way. Don't forget to read with and to your child. Share a book together and let your child see you enjoy reading as well. It is going to be a great year of learning and independence!!

SECOND GRADE TEAM:



What a wonderful start to the year! Students are quickly establishing routines, making friends and writing about their experiences. Open house was a big success with a great turnout of caring parents showing interest in their child's education. NWEA testing has been in place to show a true measure of where to begin with each child. Teachers are working hard with Daily 5 reading strategies, reading groups, math, social studies, and writing! A

special thanks to parents for making sure all reading logs and planners are signed daily. You are a big part of their success!

THIRD GRADE TEAM:



It is hard to believe we are entering the month of October! We have had a wonderful start to the school year and we thank you for all your support and patience! We have established quality routines and procedures to ensure the safety and education of our students. Please remember to check your child's planner every night. This is a great way to communicate with

parents/guardians. There is a place on the bottom for you to sign daily. If you have any questions or concerns, please write a note in the homework planner. Please continue to encourage your child to complete homework assignments and review content each evening. In the third grade, we are focusing on becoming Power Readers. Therefore, it is important for your child to read each night to support the reading instruction we are providing at school.

OCTOBER TIP

Research shows that students who read 30 minutes or more per night have an increased vocabulary and comprehension of written text because of an increased degree of exposure. Please make sure you encourage your children read for at least 30 minutes per day.

Lowrey School Reading Policy

- 1. Reading book bags will go home daily
- 2. Students must read books:

2-5 (30+ minutes daily)

- 1. Students will complete a reading assignment daily
- 2. Book Logs-- Signed daily by parents

FOURTH GRADE TEAM:



Welcome to 4th Grade! Our school year is off to a great start. We started NWEA testing. Your child has taken the Reading, Math, Language, and Science NWEA. Reading books should have already gone home. Make sure your child is reading 30 minutes every night. Be sure to sign their planners and reading logs every day! Homework packets are sent home on Monday and are due

back on Friday. Make sure your child is completing a portion of the homework packet daily. In Math, we started our unit on angles, lines, and 3 digit addition and subtraction. Unit one test will be on lines, line segment, rays, points, parallel lines, perpendicular lines, and intersecting lines. In Science, we started our unit on Energy. We have discussed Kinetic and Potential Energy. We will be focusing on the different forms of Energy. Spelling tests are every Friday. Please make sure your child is on time (8:00 am) to school daily.

FIFTH GRADE TEAM:



Welcome back to a great school year! 5th grade is filled with fun activities and many new things to learn, so we have no time to waste! NWEA took place the first couple weeks of school and will continue for a few weeks until all students have tested. Snack is an essential part of the day as it energies students and helps them focus, so please be sure to send a snack each and every day with your child. We do not eat lunch

until 12:00, so they get hungry and may not be able to concentrate. Only healthy snacks will be allowed in class, no chips, soda, cookies or candy are allowed. In math, 5th graders will be learning all about numeric operations, place value, decimals, estimation, and multiplication in next months to come. In science we will be learning about the scientific process and matter! In social studies, we are studying about our government and the Constitution. We are working on narrative writing and learning new strategies for reading. So far it has been a great start to the school year. Please be sure to sign your child's planner each day after they complete their homework. They MUST read each day for at least 30 minutes and answer questions about their book. As you know at the end of the month is Halloween. 5th graders will be allowed to wear costumes, but not to school. They can change after lunch. Please no masks or face paint or anything that is inappropriate for school, such as blood and weapons. We look forward to an amazing year with your children, thank you for putting your trust with the Lowrey family; we guarantee they are in GREAT hands :) Thank you for everything you do for our school!

Language Arts: Welcome back to another wonderful year here at Lowrey Middle School. We could not be more excited to start the school year with our new 6th graders. As you know, starting middle school comes with lots of change. Over the past month, we have been working hand in hand with our students to get to know each other. We have done multiple hands on activities to

build a strong bond to take us throughout the school year. Our students have learned to transition from class to class, open their lockers, and even make new friends. We have delved into our fall NWEA testing. Once our NWEA assessment is complete, we will move right into working in our stations, writing our journal squares, and even learning new Greek and Latin root words. You can keep in touch with all three of our 6th grade Language Arts teachers through their iBlog, REMIND application, and email.

Social Studies: Welcome back 6th graders! The Social Studies class is off to a great start this school year. We have been working on getting to know the teacher and other students, setting goals to accomplish in the content area, and the middle school norms and procedures. Also, this week we celebrated "Constitution Day" and students are working with partners to complete their posters of their understanding of the key concepts in class. Finally, we are in the process of electing classroom delegates for Student Council here at Lowrey School. We reviewed how they have the choice to run for office, presentation of their individual speeches, the voting process, and responsibilities if they are elected as a classroom delegate. The past few weeks have been fun and it just keeps on rolling from here! The Social Studies teachers use I-Blog, email, and the Remind App for updates and special announcements.

Math: Welcome back! We are so excited for this school year! Students have completed the Fall NWEA. For the first few weeks, we have been focusing on organization, classroom procedures and expectations, and building responsible and respectful communities. We have been reviewing some basic skills from 5th grade as well. Students are now beginning work on our Number System and Ratios and Proportions units. Students should be completing their Khan Academy assignments and practicing iLearn on a nightly basis. Math teachers work hard to keep their iBlog updated. Students should utilize their planners and the blogs in order to keep up with their assignments.

Science: Welcome back! The science class is off to a great start and we are looking forward to having an exciting year! For the next few weeks we will continue working on our classroom rules and expectation and setting up our interactive notebook. Please check

it to see what we have been doing in class. Science students have completed the NWEA. Also this week the students were introduced to the idea of "Everyone is a Scientist". We completed an activity called "Saving Sam" in which students had to apply the scientific process to complete. It was funny watching them complete this task. The students are looking forward to having more hands-on activities to learn and so am I. Just remember to always check iBlog for any classroom news.





Language Arts: Welcome back students and parents. Students have been focusing primarily on classroom procedures and expectations, organization skills, rebuilding stamina, and establishing healthy

relationships with one another. Students are starting to wrap up their fall NWEA assessments. Please feel free to reach any of the 7th grade Language Arts teachers via iBlog, email, or REMIND.



Math: Welcome back students and parents! In math we have been working on our basic skills: rounding rules, interpreting decimals, converting improper fractions and mixed numbers, as well as adding, subtracting,

multiplying and dividing fractions. We have set up our homework in iLearn and finished NWEA for the fall. Please feel free to reach out to any of the 7th grade math teachers via iBlog, email, or Remind!



Science: The 7th grade Science Team (Mr. Cook, Ms. Haddad & Mrs. Skaf) are working with our students to help them learn how classify substances by their physical and chemical properties, and explain the relationship of

elements to the periodic table. The students are actively engaged in hands on-classroom activities. The 7th grade team will be using Science Room 4 for labs and classroom activities.



Social Studies: Off to a great start. We are reviewing map skills, and starting with chapter 1 Ancient Civilizations. Please be sure to sign up for our blogs to stay informed about all assignments.

Eighth graders began the school year by becoming aware of classroom routines and getting acquainted with their classmates. Also, students were seated in groups in the classrooms because working in groups is highly prized at Lowrey. In this way, students learn to depend on their classmates to help solve problems and they come to realize that reading and writing are social activities. Teachers used various ways to introduce working in groups. One teacher used a card game, Blink, to impress upon students to need to understand instructions before they begin group activities, to have a leader in the group to expedite organizing the group, and a recorder to document accountability of each group member.

Eighth graders are currently reading the play <u>The Hitchhiker</u>, which focuses on foreshadowing--hints in the play that suggest what will happen. There is also a heavy emphasis on vocabulary with teachers creating word walls.

The week of the 18th is devoted to Northwest Evaluation Association, NWEA, tests of students' reading and language abilities.



Computer Applications: 7th and 8th Grade Computer Application students are working hard and learning basic computer skills to help them increase their knowledge of computers. Keep up the great work students!
