Special Needs 911 Registry Program

In an effort to improve service to Dearborn residents that have family members with mental or physical impairments such as Autism, Alzheimer's, Down syndrome and other physical conditions, the police and fire department initiated the Special Needs 911 Registry Program. The program will allow citizens (or family members) to register their residence and the information will be used to alert responding police, fire, or medical personnel of special needs individuals residing in the home.
