Conferences will be held on November 10, 16, and 17, 2016

Children do better in school when parents are involved in their academic lives. Attending parent-teacher conferences is one way you can be involved and help your child succeed. Conferences create the perfect opportunity to have conversations with your child's teacher, learn how to help your child do their best in school, and let your child know that you are aware and informed of what goes on in school.

Below are some examples of questions to ask your child's teacher at a parent-teacher conferences:

- What are my child's strengths and needs in the core subject areas?
- ♦ Is my child performing at grade level?
- ♦ How much time should my child spend on homework?
- How well does my child perform on tests and quizzes? Will my child benefit from testing accommodations?
- Are my child's assignments submitted on time and completed correctly?
- Does the school have special programs to meet my child's needs?
- Is the current classroom setting suitable for my child?
- ◆ Do you keep a folder of my child's work? If yes, could you review it with me?
- What can I do at home to support classroom learning?
- ♦ What is the best way to keep in touch with you?
