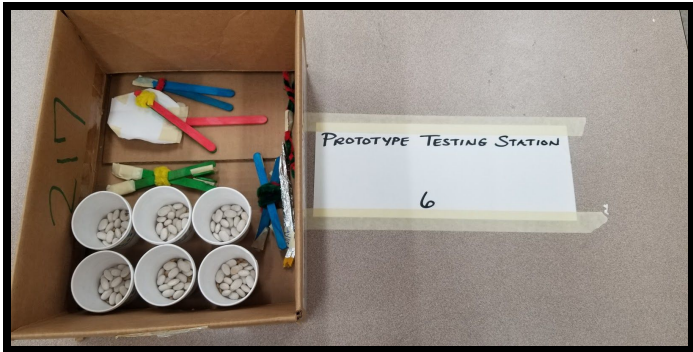
WSU visit to Salina Intermediate School
