

Need something to read? Here is a quick tutorial on how to access ebooks and audio books from the public library.

First you will need a library card. If you have a card, you are ready to go! If you need a card, you are in luck, you can get a temporary card to access online resources by filling in a short form.

This app provides access to ebooks and audiobooks. They have a large selection, but they are loaned to readers on a one book to one reader basis, just like a paper copy. For that reason, you may need to place a hold on a book and wait until it becomes available.
