- The champion will have an online qualifying quiz before February 5, 2016 to represent Stout in the State Bees that will be held on Friday, April, 1st 2016.
- The state champion will receive a medal, cash award, and other prizes, and represent the State of Michigan in a televised National Bee Finals that will take place on Monday, May 23rd through Wednesday, May 25th.
