Wednesday, Nov. 25th – Conference Release Day.

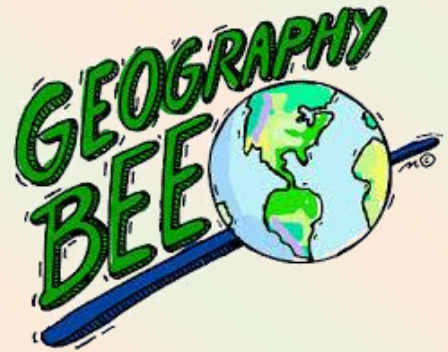
Thursday 26th and Friday 27th – Thanks Giving.
