THE DEARBORN POLICE & FIRE DEPARTMENTS ENCOURAGE FAMILIES WITH SPECIAL NEEDS TO REGISTER IN CASE OF EMERGENCY

THE DEARBORN POLICE & FIRE DEPARTMENTS HAVE JOINED FORCES AND INITIATED A SPECIAL NEEDS 911 REGISTRY FOR DEARBORN RESIDENTS WITH DISABILITIES, CHRONIC CONDITIONS OR OTHER SPECIAL HEALTHCARE NEEDS.

Quick Facts:

- ◇ Designed to identify individuals who require special assistance during emergencies
- ◇ Enrollment is completely free & voluntary
- ◇ Who should enroll:
 - ◇ Any individual, regardless of age, who has a chronic condition, disability, special healthcare need or may require additional assistance during a time of emergency.
 - ◇ Such as: Use of life support systems, mobility disabilities, visually impaired, blind, or a person with a hearing impairment. Also anyone who has cognitive, developmental or mental health disabilities (Autism, Alzheimer's, Down's Syndrome) or anyone who uses a service animal.
- ◇ If an individual cannot enroll themselves a family member or caregiver may do so.
- ◇ The Special Needs 911 Registry allows First Responders to appropriately plan, prepare for and respond to the needs of the community.
