You are wrapping up a terrific 6th grade year. Congratulations on all you achieved in your first year at Stout! Now, we're looking forward to welcoming you into our ELA classrooms in the fall. Over the summer, we will be doing a lot to prepare for the next school year. You should also be doing the

Recent research shows us that "on average, students' achievement scores declined over summer vacation by one month's worth of school-year learning" and that "the extent of loss was larger at higher grade levels" (Quinn & Polikoff). What the research is saying is that if you do nothing to prepare for 7th grade, you'll come back in the fall one month behind where you are right now! That's a lot of learning to make up for but, since you're reading this now, there is something you can do to prevent that learning loss. You can continue to read! Just as the professional athlete needs to continually practice to keep up his/her skills, you also need to practice your reading strategies to keep up your reading level.

## Here's your summer learning requirement for 7th grade Language Arts:

- Read one or more books from the following list:
  - The Devil's Arithmetic
  - o <u>The Giver</u>
  - The Hunger Games
  - <u>Monster</u>
  - <u>Soul Surfer</u>
  - The Westing Game
- Take an online comprehension test once we're back in school

That's it! Just read and enjoy the book(s) and BE SURE you understand it well! The comprehension test has 30 questions to see how well you comprehended the book. Later in the school year, we'll read another title or two off of that list. When we do, you'll be asked to compare that book with the one you read over the summer so be sure not to forget what you read!

To further prepare, you can begin to gather the suggested materials for our ELA classes. The stores will offer lots of sales during the summer where you can pick up some of the items at a great price! Be on the lookout for the following items:

- ~ A 3-ring binder (either 1" or 1 1/2")
- ~ Five divider tabs
- ~ Lined, notebook filler paper
- $\sim$  Lots of pencils & ink pens
- ~ Highlighters (in a variety of colors)
- ~ Colored pencils
- ~ 3x3 sticky notes
- ~ One pack of 3x5 index cards (for making flash cards)
- ~ Zipper/pencil pouch with holes for use in a binder (to hold flash cards)
- ~ 2 3 boxes of tissue (for class use)
