**Do Not Lose Your Bus Privilege**

Students taking the bus need to follow the bus rules of behavior. The rules are there to protect your safety and will be enforced appropriately. Students should:

- Mount and dismount the bus safely.
- Be in their proper seat all the time.
- Not extend their limbs and/or heads through the window.
- Not eat or drink on the bus.
- Keep the bus tidy and clean.
- Not damage bus or equipment.
- Not throw any objects inside or outside the bus.
- Obey the drivers' instructions and directions all the time.
- Be courteous and speak to the driver and to each other using polite tone and proper volume.
- Not use bad or foul language.
- Not fight, push, or shove.
