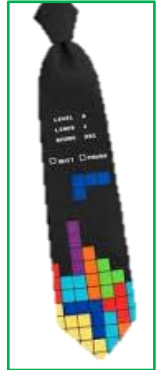
March is Reading Month Tie Contest
